### **Participant Mission Momentum Directions**

### **CHALLENGE**

The purpose of this activity is for the color group to split up into race teams. Each race team will design and create an innovative racecar track.

### **TIMELINE**

First Night of Camp:

2-hour meeting - 9-11pm (most of committee work should take place)

Second Day of Camp:

2 hours - 1-3 pm (finalization, purchasing supplies and build your design)

any last-minute changes, buying your supplies and building

2 hours - 3-5 pm (presentations and evaluations)

while you are waiting to present refer to page 14 and 15 for tasks

4:30 cleanup build ONLY IF your team has presented

### COMMITTEES

To accomplish each team's goal, your assigned race team must divide into committees. Each member must serve on at least one committee. Depending on the number of members, they may need to serve on more than one committee. Follow the committee instruction sheets to accomplish the task.

### **MATERIALS**

- Each team will be given a starter pack of supplies.
  - The build can be achieved if no other supplies are used; however, most teams will want to enhance their supplies by purchasing items from the store.
- Each team will be given \$25 in SkillsUSA Bucks to use in purchasing additional supplies.
- You may not use any materials beyond your starter pack and store supplies.
- You may purchase additional materials from the supply store, if needed.
  - The materials purchased at one time may be limited due to available supply.
- NEED or WANT to earn more money? During the build....
  - ...Your finance team can show a rubber racing duck (from Goosechase) and earn \$5, you can show us a max of 3 ducks for a total of \$15.
  - Participate in sessions, be kind, help out, and responsible
- Return unused supplies to the store

### SAFETY GUIDELINES

- No running or horseplay.
- Boxcutters will be held by advisors for each race team.
- Use respectful and responsible words and actions with peers and adults.

### REQUIREMENTS

Your racetrack must follow these requirements:

- Have a clear start and end point.
- Have at minimum of 3 maximum of 6 track obstacles: bumps, a moving part, etc.
- Track design must contain a curve and a hill at minimum but also could contain jumps, and loops, etc.
- Reflect the classic racetrack themes like cones and also have a theme your group chooses. (examples include: tv show, games, sports, construction, movie set, etc.)
- Explain how the Essential Element was used during the build process.
- Committees must complete their required pages.
- Complete the actual build time in 1 hour.

### **JUDGING**

After the build time is complete at 3pm, the judges will visit each site. (Rubric on page 16)

- You will have two minutes to give your presentation (page 9)
  - Be sure to include all details required for full points
- Not all will members are required to speak during the presentation
  - Make sure all members contribute to the creation of the racetrack
  - Make sure all members are given credit for their committee and build contributions during the presentation
- Following the presentation, one of the judges will complete the track.
- Selection of the winning track will be based on the following:
  - Presentation by the group.
    - Representation of the theme and explanation of the Essential Element that was assigned.
  - Design, creativity, and attractiveness of the track.
  - Incorporation of required elements.

### WHILE YOU ARE WAITING TO PRESENT - SEE TASKS ON PAGE 14 AND 15

- Do not leave your track unattended. (rotate group members in and out of the track area to give everyone a chance to view the competition)
- 1-2 people should stay at the track and be ready to present to judges or to demonstrate your track for other groups
- Every team member is expected to complete the various tasks on the page 14 and 15.

### **CREW CHIEF**

The state officer is your color team leader. However, each assigned race team needs to decide who will be the crew chief. The crew chief is the leader and will report status to the advisor in charge of your group and is the leader. Your team must decide this together.

The Crew Chief needs to ensure every person serves on at least 1 committee and that each name is recorded on page 7.
ESSENTIAL ELEMENT (Workforce Committee) Once you have decided on a crew chief, a team name, all of the committee members are chosen.
The Workplace Experiences Committee will go to the State Director and spin the wheel to get the Essential Element your team will be incorporating into your building process. Then read your assignment page for next steps.
ESSENTIAL ELEMENT:
THEME (Community, Alumni, and Partner Engagement Committee) Once you have decided on a crew chief, a team name, all of the committee members are chosen, AND an element has been assigned.
The committee must create a Mission Momentum track theme that complements the racetrack concept. This theme should be clearly reflected in the track's design and construction. In addition to classic racetrack elements like cones, incorporate a unique theme chosen by your group and influenced by the Essential Element assigned in the previous step — some examples communication over time (evolution past to present) self-motivation (quotes and affirmations), service orientation (helping others), etc. See your assignment page for details.
Then go to your full assignment page as your team will need to work on the design of the overall track.

## **Advocacy and Marketing Committee**

### 1. Establish a plan for social media, photos, and documentation of the activity.

- Your committee should create a social media plan for promoting the Mission Momentum experience throughout the entire activity

- Create the following
  - 2 social media posts, if you do not have internet, make them on paper
  - These posts can be basic process posts getting people excited for your build!
  - Take photos documenting the learning process, the work and process throughout the activity
    - From the first meeting until the build is complete!
  - Gather quotes from team members about what they are learning
  - Include how the Essential Element has been incorporated

### 3. Develop a marketing and promotion plan to present to the judges

- The 2 social media posts that market and promote your racetrack as the best! (on paper if you don't have internet)
- Include how the Essential Element has been incorporated
- Work with the Community, Alumni, and Partner Engagement Committee to create an advertisement for the racetrack (advertisement ideas include: a radio ad that could be presented, a video that could be watched, or a design on paper.)

#### 4. Work with the Leadership Development Committee to add requirements into the presentation

- Add social media plan
  - 2 social media posts about the process
- Marketing and promotion plan
  - 2 social media posts promoting
  - 1 Advertisement
- Explanation of how the Essential Element was incorporated into both plans.

- 1. Lead the creation of the racetrack.
- 2. Your team must use the requirements on page 3 to create the theme.
- 3. The entire team must agree on the theme.
- 4. Determine needed supplies to compete the racetrack.
  - a. Work with the finance committee to determine budget.
  - b. One member of this committee and one member of the finance committee can visit the store to collaborate on building supplies and the budget.
- 5. Create an impact statement for the presentation that reflects your team's story, what you have learned and how you have worked together.
  - a. Your impact statement should reflect the following questions
    - i. What theme did your team decide on,
    - ii. How has your race team learned to work together?
    - iii. What have you learned through this activity that you want to take back to your chapter?
- 6. Work with the Leadership Development Committee to incorporate the impact statement into the presentation.
  - a. Working with other committees successfully will help the overall presentation remain cohesive and consistent with what all of the committees on your team are doing.
  - b. Share your impact statement and all details for the presentation.

## **Financial Management Committee**

Instruction Sheet - Specific committee responsibilities: Minimum 2 people

- 1. Your committee is responsible for creating the budget for the project.
  - a. Your committee is a vital part of the success of the Mission Momentum activity.
  - b. Your team will need to determine the total amount of money, or budget, necessary to build the team's racetrack.
    - i. Work closely with the committees to determine the supplies needed and the budget required to complete the activity.
      - 1. This includes visiting the store with the committee that designs and lists supplies to ensure enough budget for build supplies.
    - ii. Example: after your first team meeting and viewing of the Supply Store, it is determined that the overall budget for the activity should be \$350.00. Your committee will then create and keep that budget throughout the project.
  - c. Use the form below to help organize the budget.
- 2. Manage the overall finances throughout the activity.
  - a. Your team will be given a starter pack of supplies.
  - b. Your team will be given \$25.00 in SkillsUSA Bucks to purchase additional supplies.
  - c. There will be opportunities for teams to earn more money.
    - i. Example: active listening during morning sessions, respect of other campers, keeping cabins and other camp areas clean, networking with members from other chapters, and more! It is up to your committee to encourage the team on ways to earn more SkillsUSA Bucks, if you need them.
- 3. Work with the Leadership Development Committee to add requirements into the presentation.
  - a. Report and share your budget and account for all expenses and any additional income received by the team.

## Leadership Development Committee

Instruction Sheet - Specific committee responsibilities: Crew Chief is on this committee + 1 person minimum

- 1. Establish a timeline for the project and oversee the construction.
  - a. Create a timeline for all the committees to complete the activity in the time allotted.
  - b. Share the timeline with the committees to manage their tasks to successfully accomplish them.
- 2. Provide leadership to the building of the racetrack for all committees.
  - a. Make certain the committees are accomplishing their assigned tasks according to the timeframe.
  - b. Do not take over for the committees but do assist as needed.
- 3. Lead the creation and practice of the presentation that is required in the project.
  - a. The presentation should include:
    - i. The race team name
    - ii. Chosen theme
    - iii. Which element was your team assigned
    - iv. Each committees' report
  - b. The presentation should be 2-3 minutes in length.
    - i. You will be stopped at 3 minutes so your judge can complete the racetrack.
  - c. It is up to the team to determine who will give the presentation
    - i. There should be more than one person who presents
- 4. Direct and manage the presentation
  - a. The presentation creation must take place while all other committee work is happening, in order to be prepared when the judge comes to evaluate your racetrack.
  - b. Drafting the presentation, sharing it with the team, editing for success, and consistent practice must be coordinated while all other work is taking place.
- 5. This committee will constantly interact with other committees throughout the process.

- c. Did members demonstrate growth in the targeted Essential Element?
- d. How could the integration of the Essential Element have been improved?
- e. How effective was the committee structure that was used?
- f. Did members learn how to utilize committees effectively to accomplish a major activity?
- g. What should change if the activity is conducted another time?
- h. Did the public relations and social media enhance the image of SkillsUSA?
- i. Each Committee's report should be part of the presentation, and presenters should be able to ask questions

## **Workforce Experiences Committee**

Instruction Sheet - Specific committee responsibilities: Minimum 2 people

- 1. After tasks from page 3 are complete:
  - a. Go to the state director and spin the wheel to get the Essential Element your group will be assigned
- Your committee is in charge ensuring the assigned Essential Element is understood, utilized and reported to the leadership committee.
  - a. The following is an example of how the Essential Element is used during this process.
    - i.EX: The team spun the wheel and was assigned element was Communication.
      - 1. Questions to ask the group to determine if everyone understands:
        - a. Who can give examples of how we can use communication?
        - b. How can communication be used during a process like this?
        - c. What if we encounter a disagreement or challenges? How can we use communication?
        - d. Who has ideas about how we can handle miscommunications?
      - 2. If they cannot answer these questions, your job is to teach them.
        - a. There are some limited information on the next pages to help you.
        - b. You may also look up information on the internet.
      - 3. In the report to the leadership committee, you would provide a summary of the conversation with the group, what they did and did not understand, how you taught them, then how you saw it implemented and how you encouraged your group throughout the process to include the Essential Element.
  - b. Talk to your group to determine if the Essential Element that you were assigned in the previous step is an Essential Element everyone is familiar with.
    - i. Ensure your team understands the Essential Element
    - ii. Can everyone on your team identify the behaviors that demonstrate the Essential Element?
    - iii. View the information on the next pages from SkillsUSA.org to learn about the Essential Element
- 3. During various processes of the build, continue to use of the Essential Element
- 4. Work with the Leadership Development Committee to explain the Essential Element you were assigned and how that Essential Element was used in the presentation
  - a. Which Essential Elements was your team assigned?
  - b. Were there other Essential Elements that were used while working on this project?

#### **DESCRIPTION**
